The Birth and Childhood of Jesus (Part 1)

People disagree over the "most" important part of worship. Is it communion, the sermon, the singing? Each element makes up the whole of God's intentions for praise and service. What is most important in the story of Jesus? Is it the crucifixion, the resurrection, His ministry and teaching? Every aspect is necessary to understand His eternal impact. For useful application, it's best to start at the beginning and focus on key factors surrounding the arrival and early life of Jesus: prophecies, dreams, visitors, names, and descriptions (Matthew 1:18-2:23; Luke 1:26-56; 2).

Prophecies

Prophecies reach into the past confirming the Messiah's identity. Does this baby fit the relevant prophecies referenced by the scribes?

The Virgin Birth (Matthew 1:22-23; Isaiah 7:14)

The virgin birth would have topped the list. It would be difficult to fake considering Jewish methods of proving virginity (Deuteronomy 22:13-29). Mary's character could have been questioned, but why would Joseph risk his reputation had he not seen the vision? The Holy Spirit's involvement provides a divine witness and Joseph's dream was perfectly timed to avoid a divorce and make sure she stayed a virgin until giving birth. He practiced uncharacteristic self-control because he fully believed.

If we deny the virgin birth, we deny inspiration of scripture. If we deny "the Word became flesh" (John 1:14), we destroy the essential deity of our savior. If Jesus wasn't conceived of the Holy Spirit, what would His death accomplish? If we deny this we render subsequent miracles powerless, including the resurrection. The great power of this sign is only God could make it possible (Luke 1:37).

Herod had an impressive historical research department and when the wise men came searching for the "king of the Jews," he became invested in ousting the potential threat. Bethlehem was a town of little consequence other than being the city of David! The potential problem is that Joseph lived in Nazareth. Circumstances didn't just "fall in place" for this couple to travel to Bethlehem, due to a census calling each man to his Hometown, on a particular night when no lodging was available except a manger!

It would be difficult to accept Him as Messiah because his family returned to Nazareth after a trip to Egypt to avoid Herod's jealous killing spree. However, discerning eyes can see God supplying the timing, knowledge, and providence. Why would God hide His chosen ruler like this? Only reading the rest of the Gospels can fully answer that, but it wasn't yet His time.

Out of Egypt (Matthew 2:15; Hosea 11:1)

God sent a messenger telling Joseph to flee Herod's onslaught. He gave specific instructions to go to Egypt to fulfill another prophecy that proved the accuracy of Jesus's identity. It proved connection with God Himself: in Hosea's prophecy God speaks of love for His children. Jesus birth and early childhood harken back to Israel's innocence and dependence before they turned to idolatry. Jesus was called out of Egypt like Moses, but He would save them from slavery to sin. A Weeping Voice (Matthew 2:17-18; Jeremiah 31:15)

Herod used the census information to commit mass murder, not unlike that of another evil King, Pharaoh of Egypt. Rachel was still weeping for her children who, centuries later, never had a chance of coming to faith in Christ, their brother. Mourning is the only appropriate reaction to this travesty further revealing the imminent need for the Messiah.

Called a Nazarene (Matthew 2:23)

Scholars debate the specific meaning, but one can see the theme connecting the rejected, suffering nature of the Messiah to Nazareth, the hometown of Jesus. Factoring in Nathaniel's reaction makes it especially relevant: "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46)

Not only does Jesus fulfill specific references but he fits the thematic trend, or personality of the anointed, but rejected ruler seen throughout the Old Testament. Only a being of great power and insight could bring this outcome. If this was merely academic that point wouldn't matter but there are eternal implications for believers.

Dreams and Visitors

The gospel authors describe vivid, specific dreams, not murky, misty imagery to be misinterpreted by Freudian followers. These were short, pointed, purposeful interactions with God's messengers.

Joseph (Matthew 1:20; 2:13; 2:19-23)

Joseph had four such encounters and quickly believed due to the Holy Spirit's involvement. He was assured of Mary's fidelity and chose to keep his promise. Based on the dream's accuracy he fled to Egypt and awaited more instructions. They came by the same method and Joseph lead his family first toward Bethlehem, then detouring to Nazareth, God's intended destination. Going through such a process would reinforce that God's hand is ever present.
