My Righteousness

The Bible says "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:20). Have you ever set a goal and exceeded it? Have you filled your quota and then some? Why? I didn't have to do more, but I wanted to. What makes us strive to be better? Some are motivated by recognition from peers. Others try to beat former versions of themselves, or perceived failings. That inner drive may be enough to achieve impressive earthly accomplishments, but eternal goals are exceeded only through eternal motivations.

Do you want to enter the kingdom of heaven? That's the carrot being dangled. Excessive righteousness has eternal reward! What better motivation could there be? Jesus also told His disciples to go the second mile, to exceed expectations (Matthew 5:40-42). Doing good just for the sake of doing good is noble. We must certainly be sure our motivation is not selfish; practicing righteousness for human recognition invalidates the heavenly reward (Matthew 6:1). However, we are encouraged to do good to all people, especially those of God's earthly kingdom (Galatians 6:9-10).

Can we do what's right just for the sake of doing what's right? Righteousness has a reward in and of itself. We can feel unmatched satisfaction by simply doing the right thing with no nagging guilt or moral quandaries. I wish I could feel that way all the time, but spirit and flesh wage war in mind and body and the spirit does not always win (Romans 7:15-20).

How do we embrace an exceeding righteousness? The difference is *trust*. Pharisees trusted human willpower to keep the Law. There is only one person righteous enough for that task. Jesus Christ, fulfilled the righteous requirement by taking punishment for all our sin (2 Corinthians 5:21). We can only be righteous through substitution, a transfer. My sins become Christ's and His righteousness becomes mine. Trust Him! Knowledge of hell makes me want to do what's right. Knowledge of heaven makes me want to do that even more. Becoming God's righteousness through Jesus makes me want to please Him in every possible way, and then some.
