## Do Not Be Deceived

Satan deceived from the beginning and has relied on this method of distraction ever since because it works (Genesis 3:13). He twisted God's words in the Garden and He tries to manipulate God's instruction today, using human help to do so. He's especially adept at deceiving the masses (2 Thessalonians 2:8-12). The Bible warns against deception, lies and falsehood. Do you like being deceived? The scriptures help deception proof our lives.

Jesus wants us aware, alert, and careful, not paranoid (**Matthew 24:4-5**). Paul listed the Corinthian's past sins; fool me once shame on you, fool me twice shame on me (**1 Corinthians 6:9-10; 15:33**). Don't go back to that toxic friendship or dangerous way! One bad apple truly can spoil the whole bunch! Though we might fool ourselves into a false sense of pride God cannot be fooled (**Galatians 6:3, 7-8**). Our words and deeds have fruit, visible results. Do we think God can't see our thoughts and intents? It's a matter of maturity when we're fooled with *empty* words; we have the scanning equipment to see through these deceptions (**Ephesians 4:14; 5:6**).

Some deceive from evil intent (2 Timothy 3:13-17). Some deceive as imposters, pretending to be God's servants. How do we parry and counter? Continue studying Scripture. Keep an active searching faith. Don't make assumptions. James points out deceptions and provides information to counteract, to free minds (James 1:16, 22, 26). The greatest deceptions quietly creep into our hearts (1 John 1:8). We can be so careful to point sin out while being lulled into a sense of sinless superiority. The dangerous deception is thinking my relationship with God is stable when it is actually severed.

Here's what we know: You can deceive yourself (**Obadiah 1:3**). You can allow yourself to be deceived by others (**Rom. 16:17-18**). You may be deceived by a popular but false idea. You may be deceived by following the majority (**Matthew 7:13-14**). Satan can hypnotize with things that look so good and are so close to truth. Of course, they say you cannot be hypnotized unless you are willing. We need to know what will happen to the deceiver (**Revelation 12:9; 20:10**). Don't let him deceive you any longer!

  - Can we be absolutely certain that God's help will sustain us in any trial we face?

  - Can Jesus empathize with us and feel compassion for us? (Heb. 4:15; 2 Cor. 1:3)
  - Should we allow His empathy to motivate our joy...? (James 1:4)
  - What two steps did Peter give us for victory over trials...? (1 Pt. 4:19)
- Conclusion We can sacrifice for Christ because we have something to hold on to...
