Pulling Hair

And I confronted them and cursed them and beat some of them and pulled out their hair. And I made them take oath in the name of God, saying, "You shall not give your daughters to their sons, or take their daughters for your sons or for yourselves." (Nehemiah 13:25, 27)

One of the most interesting scenes in scripture is described in **Nehemiah 13:25**. Nehemiah tells on himself that he actually beat some people and pulled out their hair. Why on earth would a man of God act like that? Doesn't that sound abusive?

Actually, Nehemiah's reaction seems reasonable when you look at the event. The fall of Jerusalem and destruction of the temple could be directly attributed to Israel's adoption of pagan idols and their worship. And that behavior was compounded by their tendency, in direct violation of God's commands through Moses, to intermarry with the pagan nations around them. Now, in Nehemiah's time, the temple and the walls of Jerusalem have been rebuilt, proper worship has been restored, the priesthood has resumed it's former significance – and here are former exiles who have married foreign wives and produced children who cannot even speak the language of Israel. Nehemiah's thoughts ran to Solomon who was made to sin by the foreign wives he had taken, and in anguish he asked the people, "Shall we then listen to you and do all this great evil and act treacherously against our God?" (verse 27). It was enough to make him pull their hair out.

I sometimes want to pull out my own hair, because I need some way to make my distress clearly visible. When, after good counsel against it has been given, a Christian young person chooses to marry one who does not share his or her faith, it makes me want to pull out my hair.

When a brother or sister acts in a worldly manner, accompanied by the pretense of "religion" that never follows them out the church building doors, it makes me want to pull out my hair.


When men treat their wives and children with contempt, while parading in the assembly as though nothing is wrong, it makes me want to pull out my hair.

When children suffer because parents are too busy satisfying their own cravings, it makes me want to pull out my hair.

When Christians choose to sleep in or watch TV or go to a ball game or go fishing, or anything else, when it's time to gather to study the word and worship God, it makes want to pull out my hair.

When brothers and sisters choose to withdraw themselves, complaining that the church "just doesn't meet my needs," it makes me want to pull out my hair.

I am now considering Nehemiah's approach. And, I am wondering how all of those things make God feel... by Bobby Wheat
