Covenant Signs

The Bible says, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth" (Genesis 9:17). Why does a covenant need a sign? A covenant is a contract, an agreement, a commitment, a pledge, a bond, a deal, an arrangement, an understanding. Hebrew covenants were usually accompanied by special sacrifices, words of promise or oath, and signs. The ceremony often involved cutting animal in two and both parties passing between the pieces of flesh (Genesis 15:9-10). Signs were physical memorials or markers to commemorate the treaty so both parties could point to its inception with firm details and witnesses.

God himself initiates covenants! Did He have to treat with His creation? All the usual elements were present after the flood: the sacrifice of all mankind except Noah's family, the promise never to flood the world again, and the rainbow sign in the sky as memorial. The cleansing image of this ritual is also intriguing; Noah and his family passed through the cutting away of all flesh, the dividing of good and evil, and God was with them. Who could possibly forget an experience like that? How could God's people ever let wickedness become so rampant? It didn't take Noah all that long to fall back into old habits (Genesis 9:20-27). It wasn't very long before human hubris reached dangerous heights yet again (Genesis 11:1-9). That's why covenants need signs, large, flashing, neon, billboards with sound effects amplified!

We need clear reminders of our pledges! We also need someone to hold us accountable to those agreements, witnesses to remind us of our commitments! I hope you don't enter into any covenant lightly, especially if it is a spiritual one. Count the cost of such an undertaking (Luke 14:25-33). When you enter a pact with God you can be sure there's a sign pointing you back to your choice in bold and subtle ways. Christians have a weekly reminder of the sign of our covenant in the Lord's supper (1 Corinthians 11:25). Noah's floodwaters correspond to the floodwaters of baptism, saving through the pledge of our consciences in union with God. It's a beautiful sign of the most important covenant of life. When you see these signs remember your agreement with God, and the sacrifice He made for you.
