Free Indeed

On July 4th we celebrate freedom: Freedom from tyranny and unjust governing, freedom that was bought at great price, freedom that founded a country.

Those who are born into this country are born into freedom. Others go through a detailed process to become a U.S. citizen, and in some ways they appreciate their freedom a little more. The key is citizenship. I must become a resident to partake in that freedom and protection.

Freedom is found in the Truth (John 8:32ff). Lies and facades shackle us, imprison us, and make us feel tied to the past. Truth enables us to move beyond what happened. Truth is a solid spike hammered into the rock face on which we can climb upward, toward the future. The word of God is truth (John 17:17). The Son of God is the only one who can make us free in the truest sense. Do you want to be a slave to sin any longer?

Romans 6 tells us what to do. We have to die; we have to sacrifice in order to be free.

Obedience to the law of Christ means freedom from sin. Being a citizen is supposed to bring privilege. What are the benefits of heavenly citizenship?

Christ set us free with a purpose! (Galatians 5:1, 13) Don't abuse that freedom! Don't let it go to waste. If we don't stand firm, the freedom God has granted, we will soon be enslaved again. We are free to do what is right, not whatever we feel like doing (1 Peter 2:15-16).

Because we are free people we have the right to choose. We can choose to be slaves to a good and kind master. That master is Jesus Christ. You can find freedom in His service.

Let Me Reassure You!

Text: (1 John 4:13-14)

Introduction: (Matthew 7:21-23)

- Note especially the words of Jesus: "I never knew you."
- Ringing loud and clear in this letter is the message: "Let me reassure you!"
- What about "Gnosticism"? (Late 1st and early 2nd century teaching)
- John uses Gnostic vocabulary to destroy their divisive methods.
- So how do we know we are secure in our relationship with God?

1. Assurance Based on Obedience to His Commands

- Have you ever been in a relationship where you had no idea what your responsibility was? (1 John 2:3-6)
- There are two ways that we can be reassured in these verses:
 - A. If we obey his commands (verse 3)
 - B. If we walk as Jesus walked (verse 6)

2. Assurance Based on a Lifestyle of Love

- It's difficult to balance "being righteous" with "loving brothers" (1 John 3:10).
- We need to watch the way we speak of and treat each other (1 John 3:14-16).
- · Are we behaving like Gnostic heretics, thinking it was their job to judge?

3. An Assurance that Goes Beyond the Subjective

- If it depended on us, then we would be in grave trouble (1 John 3:19-20).
- We are sinners. All have sinned. This is not very reassuring! (Romans 3:23)
- When does your heart "condemn" you?
- Our security depends, not on our performance, but His mercy! (1 John 4:16)

4. An Assurance Given in Scripture

- Is this "once saved always saved theology"? (1 John 5:13-20)
- The Christian who doesn't "obey" God's commands shouldn't feel reassured.
- The person who is unloving should feel no such reassurance!

5. Those Who Had Left

- This is where we get to the heart of the issue (1 John 2:18-19).
- The hurt goes both ways:
 - o Those who leave do so wounded and bleeding.
 - o Those who remain must carry the task on, but do so similarly hurt.
- What happens to those who remain?
- But what does John say about those who left?
- I have heard all kinds of reasons for abandoning God's people (1 John 1:8-10).
