The Blame Game

The Bible says, "Noah was a righteous man, blameless in his generation" (Genesis 6:9). Have you ever played the blame game? I don't know that it's ever been formalized and put into production by the Milton Bradley Company, but it certainly is one of the most popular games of all time. We saw Adam and Eve try it out for the first time in the garden, blaming each other and the serpent for their own disobedience. The cold, brutal reality we have to face is that no one is truly blameless! (Romans 3:23) How can God say that about His servant Noah? He wasn't the only one who achieved this status in scripture (Job 1:1, 8; 2:3; Daniel 6:22; Luke 1:6).

What are the qualifications for blamelessness? Are we talking about absolute perfection in every thought and action while living our physical existence? Noah did actually make mistakes; in fact, one is recorded for us. God corrected Job on his presumptions as well. So, we're not talking about people who never misstep or stumble, rather, they reacted rightly when inevitably making mistakes. Noah is set in contrast with one of the most wicked generations of all time. The very reason God sends the flood is to wipe out that evil. So, it wasn't the greatest of compliments, and the bar wasn't set very high. Instead of blaming the world around him, and making excuses, Noah chose to walk with God! When he did stumble, he got back up and found the rhythm of God's footsteps once again! (1 John 1:5-10)

The process of becoming blameless in God's sight is one of commitment, sanctification, continual cleansing and even re-cleansing. Paul often calls it reconciliation and he wants us to stand out in contrast to our generation as well (Philippians 2:12-16; Colossians 1:22-23). My friends let's stop playing the blame game! Fold your cards and pack up the pieces. It's a useless endeavor. However, we should strive to live up to the blameless image God has given us, because Christ took all the blame upon himself at the cross (Ephesians 1:3-6). Keeping His innocence in mind should motivate us to remain innocent as well. Will you live for Him?
